Message from the CEO & President

To our valued supporters,

The year 2021 saw a shift in our organizations priorities as we adjusted from the fall-out of COVID-19 and the limitations it placed on our ability to be physically present in Haiti. It forced us to ask ourselves, if we could

never go back to Haiti, how would that change our work? What would need to happen in order for our work to continue, for us to keep healthcare accessible to our Haitian communities? What presented itself as a devastating question - the thought of never seeing our dear friends and neighbors in person again was truly a painful thing for us to consider - turned out to be remarkably refreshing and grounding. What better opportunity to ensure that our work truly elevates the people of Haiti than being forced to fully remove ourselves from the equation, and in doing so center every aspect of our work entirely around them? As we wrestled with these pivotal questions,



we began to experience a shift as an organization, one that we believe will continue to draw us closer together and closer to our vision.

As a result of this shift in perspective, we found ourselves exercising our collective creativity as we ventured into new opportunities to connect with donors and other supporters. We expanded our fundraising efforts in launching the first Hit the Links for Haiti golf scramble, engaging 92 participants and raising over \$8,000. The incredible

success of this first event led to our plans to host the second such golf scramble in June of 2022, and we are looking to make this a recurring event each year. We also expanded our connections in our local community here in Michigan, participating in the first "Hub for Haiti" event that allowed us to connect with other local non-profits who provide financial support for communities in Haiti. We are excited at the prospect of partnering with these local organizations in the future for combined fundraising and other partnership opportunities.

Perhaps most encouraging, we managed to raise over \$20,000.00, the most we have EVER raised in a single fiscal year since we were established. In doing so, we were able to continue sponsoring mobile medical clinics and will have the funds to add an ADDITIONAL clinic for 2022, bringing us to a total of 5 clinics and one step closer to full

year-round medical support of the three communities we are currently investing in. We are grateful that in spite

of the difficulties we have faced over the past several years, our efforts continue to produce results as we pursue goals of community support over the long-term.

As we reflect on 2021, we remain grateful for the opportunities the year provided us to demonstrate our flexibility and evolution as an organization. As we continue to experience growth and maturation, we find that in spite of it all, our vision itself does not change. Rather, we find ourselves gaining a more complete understanding of what our vision means, and how it is that we are conforming to it. Perhaps most of all, we remain grateful for the everyday individuals who walk alongside us on this journey, for people like you, dear reader, who continue to provide their unwavering support for this cause. It is because of you that our Haitian brothers and sisters continue to have hope, and for that we cannot express our gratitude enough. We look forward to continuing our journey in 2022 with you by our side.




Financial Summary: 2017-2021














Ways to Support

Because we have specific donors who cover our overhead costs, the funds donated to us are used only for supporting our projects in Haiti. Not a single person in our organization, from volunteer to CEO receives any kind of financial compensation for their work. The costs of our annual trips to Haiti are funded entirely out-of-pocket by the volunteers who attend.

For funds that are donated online through our secure PayPal system, Paypal receives 0.05% as credit card insurance, but the entirety of what remains from your donation makes its way to Haiti
