LETTER FROM THE CEO AND PRESIDENT

Dear Friends and Supports,

As we reflect on another year at Project Piti Pami (3P), I am filled with gratitude for all we have accomplished together in our mission to provide essential healthcare to the underserved communities in Haiti. This year has been one of growth, new partnerships, and unwavering commitment to those in greatest need—especially during these challenging times.

One of the highlights of the year has been our strategic partnership with Haiti Medical Project (HMP) at the leadership level. As members of the new HMP Working Group, a select few members of 3P Leadership participate in planning and strategizing decisions made by HMP to ensure the continued success of the program. Most recently, they met to discuss the transition of leadership for a few key members of HMP on the ground in Haiti, and are sending delegates to northern Haiti in January for a leadership meeting for these new members.



Additionally, we are proud to share that for the first time since 2018, we sent a delegation to Haiti in person. Partnering with friends from the organization Partnership of Pastors International, our Chief Revenue Officer Tom Taugher was able to travel into Northern Haiti in mid December to Pignon with Missionary Flights International. This was on the heels of a 30-day ban on all flights entering Haiti from the US issued by the FAA following an unfortunate incident involving gunfire aimed at Spirit Airlines flights entering the Port-au-Prince airport in November of 2024. While much of our work has continued remotely due to the ongoing challenges posed by the political and economic climate, we are pleased to once again connect directly with the people we serve. We look forward to how this new partnership will allow us to continue serving our partner communities in Northern Haiti.

Amidst all the changes, we are also proud to celebrate the things we continue to do well. Our annual Hit the Links for Haiti Golf Scramble remains a cornerstone event, raising funds and awareness to support our vital programs. This year's scramble brought together friends, partners, and supporters, all of whom share our commitment to Haiti's healthcare needs, and contributed to our raising a total of \$19,251.71 in 2024. This funding supported the successful completion of 121 new latrines serving 1,515 people and 6 new wells in communities across the country.



Our annual leadership retreat was another bright spot this year. This retreat allows our board and staff to come together, renew our focus, and reflect on our strategies. It's an invaluable time to strengthen our unity and ensure we are moving forward with clarity and purpose. We have pursued a new rhythm in our organization over the past two years, entering a "rest season" from December through February and a "work season" beginning with our leadership retreat in March and culminating in our Benefit Dinner in November - which we are excited to announce will take place on Saturday November 8th 2024 in Petoskey Michigan.










FINANCIAL SUMMARY OF 2024

BECOME A DONOR

Because we have specific donors who cover our overhead costs, the funds donated to us are used only for supporting our projects in Haiti. Not a single person in our organization, from volunteer to CEO, receives any kind of financial compensation for their work. The costs of our annual trips to Haiti are funded entirely out-of-pocket by the volunteers who attend. For funds that are donated online through our secure PayPal system, Paypal receives 0.05% as credit card insurance, but the entirety of what remains from your donation makes its
