A Message from the CEO and President

What an amazing time to be a part of Project Piti Pami (3P)!

We have raised over \$30,000 in total since being founded in 2017, with our monthly support increasing by 36% over the past year. With this funding, 3P was able to fully sponsor 8 mobile medical clinics within the three communities we support in Haiti, bringing much needed healthcare to approximately 1,200 patients. We lead 3 successful teams to Haiti and in the process delivered over 300 lbs of donations and supplies to our partners. When faced with a challenge in transporting an ultrasound machine to our physician partners, our supporters rose to the challenge and helped us successfully raise over \$600 in less than 24 hours—fully funding the cost of shipping.

It has also been a season of trial and error, of learning by experience and taking risks. We developed and piloted a new paper Health Passport system to remedy the need for medical record keeping and continuity of care, which was well-received and has entered the next phase of development. We launched our innovative 3P Liaison program, which allows us to employ Haitian citizens to travel to our adopted communities in our absence to collect data, lead educational programs, and support the Health Passport system.

Within our own organization, we endured a season of growing pains, regularly revisiting our mission and vision as a nonprofit, and engaging in difficult conversations about expectations and investment. This season of struggling together produced a deepened level of connection to our mission and one another. We took a number of risks in completely restructuring our leadership, our patterns of communication, and the function of our meetings in order to optimize the use of our energy and time. In doing so, we found ourselves creating a culture that values transparency, promotes feedback, and inspires creative growth.

I am stunned by what has been accomplished through our little nonprofit in such a short time. We are such a young organization, not only in years but in the experience of our members and leaders—and yet we continue to make incredible progress. This is due not only to the collaborative culture of our organization, the caliber of individuals who are contributing their time and energy, and the shared cause we rally around, but also to the devotion and support of you, our partners. As we reflect on the triumphs and tribulations of the past year, we cannot overstate our gratitude to our financial partners. Without your dedication to our cause, trust in our leadership, and generosity in support, our work would simply not be possible.



In light of these milestones, we must ask ourselves what comes next. In 2020, we aim to fully financially sponsor four annual clinics in our three communities of focus: Croix-des-Bouquets, Savanette, and Mon Boulaj. This commitment requires us to increase our regular support to \$2,000 per month. To make this vision a reality, **we are searching for 65 people who will partner with us at \$25 per month.** Perhaps you, friend, could be part of the answer to this call.

I have confidence that as long as we remain grounded in our mission for sustainability and propelled forward by our vision to empower Haitian communities, our upward growth will only continue. As we develop the means to support a greater number of communities in need, the reach of our organization will increase. This next financial milestone to fully fund the healthcare needs in our communities of focus is within sight—but we can only reach it if we work together.

Hosted 3 successful 5K fundraisers on the campus of SVSU with plans to continue this for next year



Hosted successful special fundraisers to ship a donated ultrasound machine and food to our physician partners in Haiti



Developed a Health Passport medical record system to improve continuity of care for patients in clinics



Developed and launched our 3P Liaison program



Sponsored 8 total clinics, treating approximately 1,200 patients total

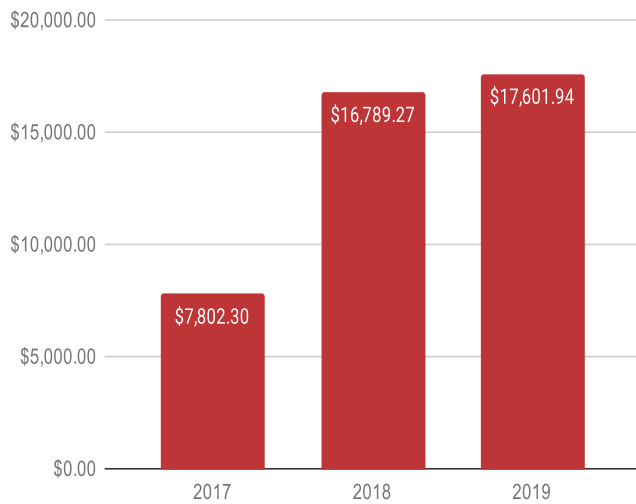

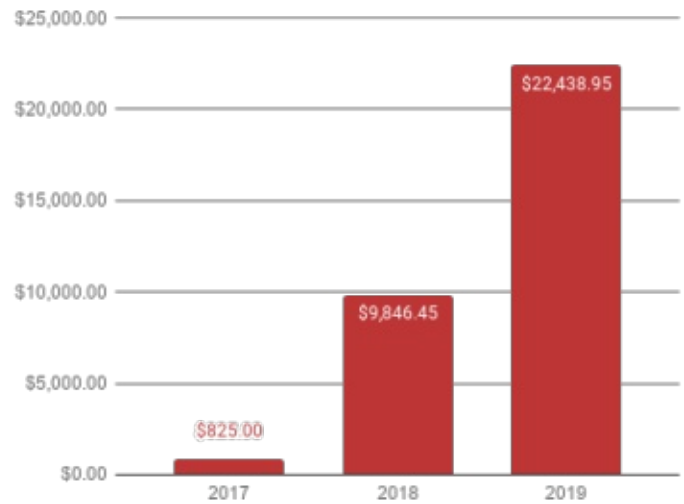

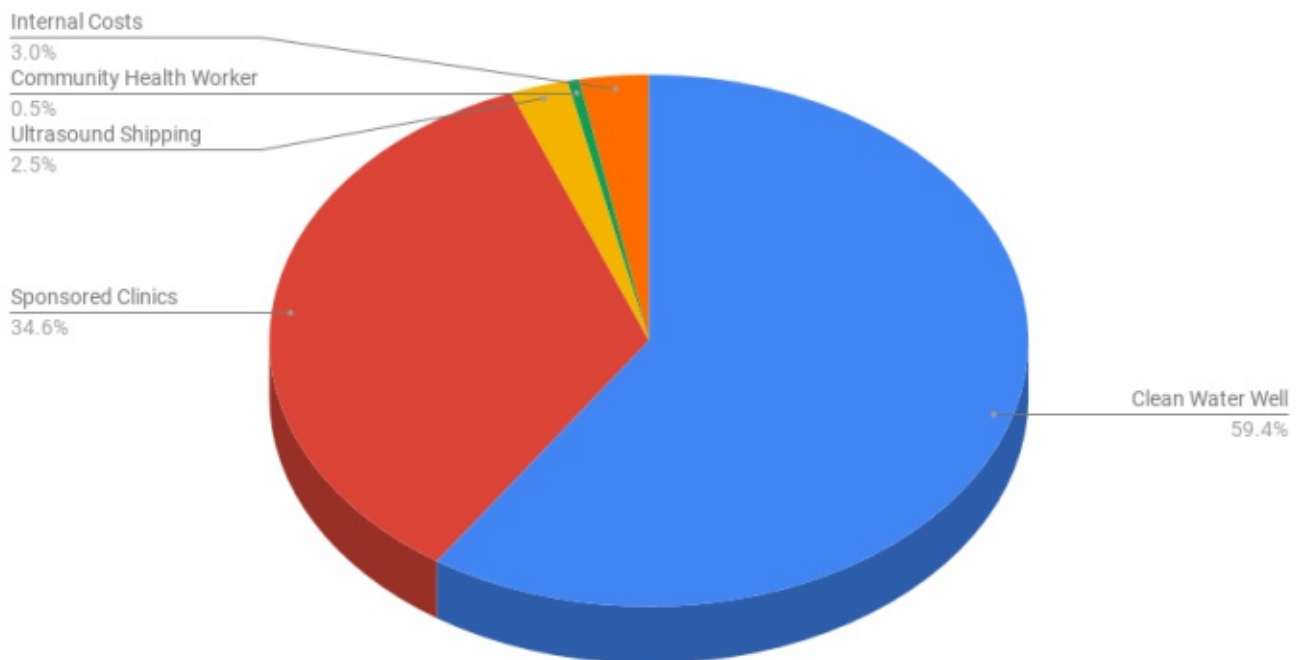
Total Donations

Because we have specific donors who cover our overhead costs, the funds donated to us are used only for supporting our projects in Haiti. Not a single person in our organization, from volunteer to CEO receives any kind of financial compensation for their work. The costs of our annual trips to Haiti are funded entirely out-of-pocket by the volunteers who attend.

For funds that are donated online through our secure PayPal system, Paypal receives 0.05% as credit card insurance, but the entirety of what remains from your donation makes its way to Haiti.
